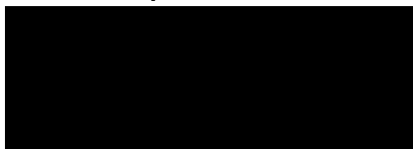

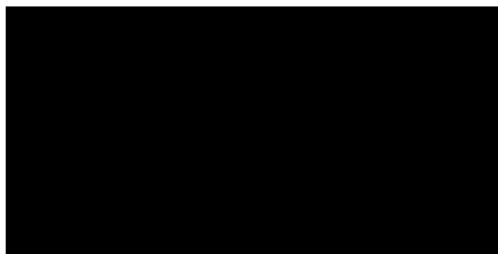

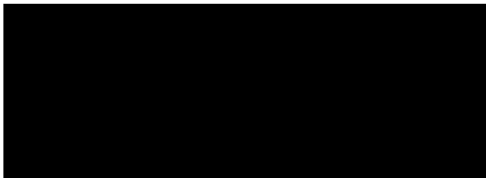
Given this, my intention is to assist the pro-democracy Hong Kong students at Curtin to find an appropriate and safe way to express their opinions and

- Could the University make a public statement to remind all students about the core value of Australia (e.g., in relation to free speech) and the core value of Curtin(e.g.,respect), and most importantly, to express their view and opinion in a lawful and orderly manner?
