Freedom of information request no. 03-2025

1 The purpose of this letter is to give you a decision about access to documents that you requested under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (*FOI Act*).

2 You requested access to documents relating to the *Marriage Amendment (Definition and Religious Freedoms) Act 2017* on 30 July 2024. Specifically you sought access to:

"A copy of the Marriage Amendment (Definition and Religious Freedoms) Act 2017, as passed in full with signature of the Royal Assent (as well as, if there is any, signature/wording from the federal parliament or speaker)."

Decision and reasons for decision

3 I, Stephen Campbell, General Manager Corporate, am an officer authorised under subsection 23(1) of the FOI Act to make decisions in relation to FOI requests.

4 In response to your request, a true copy of the Governor-General's signature on the Marriage Amendment (Definition and Religious Freedoms) Act 2017 is attached.

5 No documents were identified that fall within the scope of your request for signature/wording from the Federal Parliament or Speaker of the House.

Your review rights

9 If you are dissatisfied with the information provided, you may apply for internal review or Information Commissioner for a review. We encourage you to seek internal review as a first step as it may provide a more rapid resolution of your concerns.

Internal review

10 Under section 54 of the FOI Act, you may apply for an internal review of my decision. Your application must be made within 30 days after the date of this letter.

11 An internal review will be conducted by a different officer. No particular form is required to apply for review although it will assist your case to set out in the application the grounds on which you believe that the original decision should be overturned. An application for a review of the decision should be lodged in one of the following ways:

12 If you choose to seek an internal review, you will subsequently have a right to apply for Information Commissioner review of the internal review decision.
