# FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (FOI) REQUEST – NOTICE OF DECISION UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1982 (CTH) (FOI ACT)

# Your review rights

## Internal review

- 5. Under section 54 of the FOI Act, you may apply in writing to the CDPP for an internal review of my decision. The internal review application must be made within 30 days of the date of this letter.
- 6. Where possible please attach reasons why you believe review of the decision is necessary. The internal review will be carried out by another officer within 30 days.

## Information Commissioner review

- 7. Under section 54L of the FOI Act, you may apply to the Australian Information Commissioner to review my decision. An application for review by the Information Commissioner must be made in writing within 60 days of the date of this letter, and be lodged in one of the following ways:
